Prerequisite notes for pharmaceutical science, pharmacy: Students who enter either the Bachelor of Pharmaceutical Science or Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours) program may become eligible to enter the Bachelor of Pharmaceutical Science, Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours) double degree.

How CAN I APPLY?

AUSTRALIAN YEAR 12 PROGRAMS

You will need to apply through SATAC using UniWeb (satac.edu.au/undergraduate). Main round applications open in August and close in early December, however you may still apply through SATAC until early January as there are further offer rounds in January. As an international student you can apply for up to six degree programs and if eligible, receive an offer from SATAC in the main offer round, which will be in December shortly after Year 12 results are released. Although you receive your offer from SATAC, you will need to accept and respond directly to the University as soon as possible.

BONUS POINTS FOR STUDENTS OF AUSTRALIAN YEAR 12 PROGRAMS

Bonus points are automatically processed by the South Australian Tertiary Admissions Centre (SATAC) based on eligible subjects students passed in year 12.

Universities' Language, Literacy and Mathematics Bonus Scheme:

All eligible students will be awarded 2 points, up to a total maximum of 4 points, for successfully completing (C- or better) a subject in any one of these categories:

- > 20 credits of a LOTE in the Languages Learning Area
- > 2ELS20 English Literary Studies or 2ESH20 English;
- > 2MHS20 Mathematical Methods or
- > 2MSC20 Specialist Mathematics.

Universities' Equity Scheme:

Students of certain specified schools in SA/NT will be awarded 5 bonus points. The list of eligible schools can be found on the SATAC website and is updated annually.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS:

From 2018 the following SACE subjects or their interstate/international equivalents will be considered acceptable 'Year 12 English subjects':

- > English Literary Studies
- > English
- > Essential English
- > English as an Additional Language
