People trafficking and slavery is real. Trafficking affects every continent and most countries. It happens today, even in Australia. Women, children and men are trafficked within their own countries and across international borders.

Every year over 600,000 - 800,000 people are trafficked across national borders. From the chocolate slaves to child labourers to the sex trade, human trafficking is the third largest source of income and the fastest growing form of organised crime, exceeded only by arms and drugs trafficking. People are trafficked into prostitution, forced labour, military service, domestic service, forced illegal adoption and forced marriage.

People trafficking generates \$31 billion annually and enslaves 27 million people around the globe.
