Since 2019, we have welcomed over 500 students to study at our university as a visiting international student on an F-1 non-degree student visa or J-1 exchange visitor visa. Students can earn university credit or complete a short-term English program in the US, and return to their home university to complete their degree.

PROGRAM OPTIONS

Visiting students may study at Minnesota State University Mankato for either 1 semester (fall OR spring), or 1 academic year (fall AND spring).

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All applicants must have completed at least 2 semesters and hold a 2.5+ GPA TOEFL iBT score 61 and above, or IELTS score 5.5 and above:


enroll as <u>regular students and take 12-16 academic course credits</u> of per semester.


TOEFL iBT score 54-60, or IELTS score 5.0:


Placed in the <u>Advanced level of the Intensive English Program (IEP)</u> in first semester before regular admission in second semester. Can take **3-4 English courses** (12-16 hours per week), and up to **2 academic courses** for a maximum of 8 credits (8 hours per week).

TOEFL iBT score between 20-54 or IELTS score between 3.5-4.5:

Placed in the <u>Intermediate or Beginner levels of the IEP</u> and take **5 English courses** for 20 hours per week.









HOW TO APPLY

Step 1: University Nomination

University Outgoing Exchange coordinator must send a letter, which nominates the student(s) who will study abroad. The nomination letter should include the following information:

- Student's full name.
- · Student's date of birth.
- Intended term of study at MSU Mankato (e.g. Spring 2025). Summer terms are not available.
- Student's personal email.
- Student's intended field of study at MSU Mankato.

Step 2: Student Application

Upon receipt of the nomination letter, MSU Mankato Center for Global Engagement office will send the nominated students a link with instructions to complete the online application. Students will need to prepare the following documents to apply online:

- · Copy of valid passport
- · Current university transcripts
- Proof of English proficiency (e.g. TOEFL or IELTS)
- Proof of financial resources (see estimated costs on the following page)

For Spring Semester Study

Nomination and priority application deadline is October 15. Final application deadline is November 1.

For Fall Semester Study

Nomination and priority application deadline is March 1. Final application deadline is May 1.




ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

University-wide exchange agreements allow visiting international students to enroll in courses in any academic department on campus regardless of their declared major. Admission to upper division courses will be determined by the academic qualifications of the student. Students need to meet all pre-reqs for upper division courses and must transcripts in English during the admission process. Some courses will be closed to exchange students. 
