For Exchange & Visiting Students (ERICA Campus)

Grading, Credits and Transcripts

Credits and Study Load

Hanyang 1 credit consists of 15 contact hours. And 3 credits mean 3-hour a week. The minimum credits for HYU students per semester is **10** and the maximum is **20**. Students usually take 15~18 credits per semester, but this rule is not strictly applied to exchange & visiting students. Thus, we recommend exchange & visiting students take 2~3 courses.

*If you are taking **Intensive Korean** (3 credits), you are still required to take at least one Major or Elective course. If you are taking **Survival Korean** (3 credits), you have to take at least two Major or Elective courses.

Evaluation and Grade

Although the evaluation method may differ based on professor's policy, attendance is always an essential part of the evaluation process. Hanyang does not have re-sit examinations so the final grade inputted into the system cannot be changed.

Transcript

Transcript is available within 1-2 weeks after the semester is over. OIA will send two copies of your transcript to your home university coordinator directly (Exchange Student) or to you (Visiting Student) after then.


Course Search and Syllabi

English-taught Course List

The course list for the upcoming semester is ready approximately a month before the semester starts. Once released, the list sorted upon the consultation between OIA and each College Admin team will be shared by email. So even though you can find other English-taught courses from the course registration website, but if they are not in the list we shared, the courses **may not be available** for exchange and visiting students. 1. **Go** to Hanyang Course Registration website (https://portal.hanyang.ac.kr/sugang/sulg.do). In case the page is shown in Korean, click the English flag at the right top to change the language setting. And click "**Course Catalog**".



*Registration Guidelines(수강안내): Course registration guidelines are here, but mostly in Korean.


2. Search the course list as below.


1) ERICA Campus Undergraduate

- Select "College/School: ERICA COLLEGE", and set "Year" and "Semester". Check "English-only Courses" and click "Search" button. Then, the list of English-taught courses will appear.




*If you want to search undergraduate courses in Seoul campus, choose "COLLEGE.

- If you want to find major courses only, check "Major Course" and choose "College" and "Dept./Major".



*If you cannot find the full table as above, please zoom out the screen.

- If you want to find elective courses only, check "Gen. Ed" and click "Search" button.

- To find graduate courses, choose "GRADUATE SCHOOL".





3. You can **check** the syllabus by clicking "Course No." of the course. The course description (simple version) is also available when you click "Couse Code".

Course Registration

The Way Courses Are Carried Out

Due to the COVID-19, the way courses is offered (either online/ offline, or both) in the upcoming semester will be decided about 5~6 weeks before the semester starts. Even though most courses are to be online, Hanyang accept exchange & visiting students only when they are physically staying in Korea.

How-to-register Courses

Like other HYU students, all exchange & visiting students are required to register courses online on their own. Hanyang's course registration system works on "First Come, First Served" basis, and is scheduled twice. During the registration period, they can freely add or drop courses upon their preferences. But students must be aware that NOT all English-taught courses will be available, it may be very difficult to register for some courses and their preferred choices of courses are NOT GUARANTEED. Kindly be flexible with course preferences. If you have any essential courses required for graduation, we suggest to take it at your home university.

Course Registration in Other Majors

You can also register courses from different department or major, but it is not 100% guaranteed that all professors will accept you if your background for the course of the very dept./ major is not enough.



Course Registration for Graduate students

As the Office of Graduate School is only in Seoul campus, all exchange & visiting students (regardless of your level of study in your home university) coming to ERICA are enrolled on the 4th grade at undergraduate level. But Graduate students will have no problem in registering and taking either undergraduate or graduate courses at ERICA. You will be informed regarding this later.

Korean Language Courses (as of Spring 2021)

All exchange & visiting students can take free Korean language courses at ERICA Institute of International Education (IIE). Two types of Korean language courses are offered: Intensive Korean and Survival Korean. Please refer to the table below.

Grades & Transcript		 As Korean Language courses are offered by an auxiliary organization within our university, grades are only available as a form of physical transcript, not through HY-in portal. Transcript of Korean courses will be sent to your home university or to you with the transcript of regular courses. It should be also checked with your home university that the credits earned from taking Korean language courses can be acknowledged in your home university. Hanyang allows to take a maximum of 20 credits per semester. And the credits earned from Korean courses are part of the maximum credits. 		
Note		[Survival Korean Applicants] 1. This course can be cancelled if the # of applicants are less than 11. 2. Students should take at least 3 regular courses from Hanyang University. 3. Applicants after the deadline can be denied. 4. The class is on Tuesdays & Thursdays, but upon request, extra class on Mondays & Wednesdays can be opened with a minimum of 11 students. [Intensive Korean Applicants] 1. Your class will be assigned after level test and you cannot change your level after then. 2. Students taking the same level twice can only get the first semester's credit transferred. 3. We advise you to take only 1 regular course (either 2 or 3 credits) from Hanyang University since the course is very intense!
