

Tomorrow's professionals

We prepare our students beyond the classroom, with a strong focus on creating modern professionals who are ready to create real impact. Our highly practical and industry-aligned approach to teaching and learning is coupled with unique initiatives that aim to further develop the skills needed for global careers.

The UniSA+ Award is a co-curricular program, which explores practical skills in modern leadership, entrepreneurship, cultural understanding and self-awareness. The UniSA Leadership Program is also designed to focus on the qualities needed to thrive in a globally competitive environment, including emotional intelligence, conflict resolution, effective communication, personal branding and goal setting.



Improving access

Our commitment to equity and access to higher education is a cornerstone of our foundation and future, underpinned by our founding Act (1990). In 1993, we were the first university to appoint a Pro Vice Chancellor with the task of improving access to tertiary education.

Since then, we have made university study a reality for thousands of students from a wide variety of backgrounds. In fact, our student community is the most diverse in the state. We are South Australia's leading university for students with a non-English speaking background, disability and low socio-economic status. We also have the largest cohort of regional and Aboriginal students, along with female students completing studies in non-traditional areas (2019 Department of Education, Skills and Employment Data – Equity Groups).

The introduction of UniSA College has been a key pillar to our success. Through a suite of alternative entry programs, students are able to access pathway options into university. A dedicated team, UniSA Connect, also engages with schools and the community to further encourage students to pursue tertiary study.


Flexible and online learning

The University has over 25 years of experience in delivering online and distance education. We are focused on supporting our students to be highly capable professionals in a digital age, through engaging curriculum and access to industry-standard tools, technologies and software. Students also learn and connect through a fully-integrated digital learning platform.

Flexibility is critical in the modern day. Across our suite of programs, we offer part-time, online, blended and accelerated learning. We are also committed to expanding our flexible learning arrangements, to meet the demands of future students and the changing tertiary landscape.

We have a sector-leading digital library that provides any time access to over 700,000 eBooks and eJournals, along with more than 150,000 video-based resources. Studying on demand

A significant part of our digital growth has been the launch of UniSA Online. In 2018, we developed a suite of 100% online degrees in high demand areas such as ageing, psychology, public health, digital media, financial planning, construction management, data analytics, and more.

UniSA Online offers full flexibility for students, helping to meet the demands of modern life. Students are able to Study On Demand with the ability to learn in short blocks and access an online learning environment anywhere, any time and on any device. Students can also access personalised support services over extended hours, seven days a week.

The fully-interactive, media-rich experience is designed to enhance learner engagement. There are online communities for support and discussions, capabilities to build an e-portfolio, sit an exam online and participate in virtual classrooms with dedicated course facilitators. We are transforming online learning and leading the digital learning experience.

UniSA Online has achieved great success within the undergraduate market and has now extended its offerings to include both postgraduate and international audiences.

Reconciliation

We have a proud history in Aboriginal education, embedding real and measurable actions within our institution, and extending the process of cultural change to strengthen our position as the University of Choice for Aboriginal Peoples.

In 2014, we released our first Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP). A framework for building relationships, deepening respect and providing more opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

Since then, we have continued to grow as an inclusive institution. We have implemented major reform for Aboriginal education, developed new economic partnerships with Aboriginal organisations, and created a leadership position directly responsible for Aboriginal engagement and strategy at the senior management level.

Through the release of our Stretch RAP 2018-21, we are continuing to build on our track record of achievement and challenge our understanding of reconciliation.

Meaningful mentorship

In 2017, UniSA announced a 10 year partnership with CareerTrackers – a non-profit organisation that creates internship opportunities for Aboriginal university students, which align with their degree and career goals. It's aimed at supporting students by linking them with private sector employees to participate in paid multi-year internships, and full-time employment upon completion of their degree.

Aiming for success

The Australian Indigenous Mentoring Experience (AIME) is based at the University and provides Aboriginal high school students with the skills, opportunities, belief and confidence to finish school at the same rate as their peers.

Pathway to the future

The Aboriginal Pathway Program is offered to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students through UniSA College as an alternative pathway into a bachelor's degree or diploma with UniSA. The program is free and provides additional support to help students succeed at the tertiary level.

Circle of collaboration

Our Program Director of Aboriginal Studies, Dr Karen Sinclair, is a proud Ngarrindjeri woman and educator, and is exploring new ways of bringing knowledge and teaching practices of the world's oldest living culture into higher education.

Through a strategic partnership with the Menzies Australia Institute, a school of global affairs based at King's College in London, Dr Sinclair participated in a three-month placement that celebrated the sharing of Indigenous knowledges and the identity and contribution of First Peoples in Australia.

The centrepiece of the program was a workshop based on the Aboriginal yarning circle – a practice that has been used by Indigenous people for thousands of years to discuss issues and ideas in a way that breaks down structures and encourages inclusion and collaboration

Mawson Lakes





Whyalla



Don't just take our word for it...

New heights

UniSA researchers are currently developing a 'pandemic drone' in partnership with Canadian drone technology company, Draganfly Inc, to help detect people with infectious respiratory conditions such as COVID-19. Fitted with a specialised sensor and computer vision system, the drone will use algorithms to monitor temperature, heart and respiratory rates, as well as detect people who are coughing and sneezing in crowds.

Reinventing the coffee cup

The design problem for disposable coffee cups has always been about delivering a product that doesn't leak and is recyclable. In collaboration with the manufacturing and packaging company, Detpak, UniSA researchers are testing new ways to transform the humble takeaway cup using expert thin film coatings. It is estimated that Australians use around a billion throw away coffee cups each year and around 16 billion worldwide.

UniSA Cancer Research Institute

Located in Adelaide's BioMed City, the UniSA Cancer Research Institute is the new leading destination for health research and teaching. It's home to one of the most significant concentrations of cancer researchers in the state and features the latest tools and technologies to support improvements in patient diagnostics and treatments.

Big ventures

UniSA Ventures is focused on creating business opportunities by leveraging the needs of industry against the core capabilities and intellectual assets of our world-class research. It creates opportunities for industry to engage with the University and secure commercial interest in innovative technologies that have commercial applications.

Healthier communities

Investigative work conducted by UniSA researchers was instrumental in building the foundation for the Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety – a deep dive into the aged care sector in Australia, focusing on systemic failures and ways to better deliver core services. The same researchers, with expertise in mental health, are also focusing on suicide prevention, contributing to shifts in policy, education and research. This research extends to the development of new guidelines for screening or viewing a movie, TV series or documentary portraying acts of suicide.

Ready for combat

Saab Australia and UniSA are collaborating on the design of new combat consoles for Australia's fleet of submarines and ships, bringing together the knowledge and design of defence technologies with industrial design capabilities and expertise in human factors. Saab has been selected to provide the combat management system and tactical interfaces for all ships in the Royal Australian Navy and the research group will be based at our Mawson Lakes Campus.

A silver lining

Vaccinations are the world's frontline defence against infectious diseases. UniSA researchers have revolutionised vaccination and drug delivery through the development of self-sterilising microneedle patches, which not only sterilise the injection site, but are also fully dissolvable. This is a giant step in providing safer vaccinations and reducing infections from improperly sterilised syringes and needles.

Workplace health check

UniSA is leading the world's first study into the psychosocial safety climate of workplaces through the Centre of Workplace Excellence. A national and international research platform will be established to explore the global trends in increased anxiety and depression and the rise in psychologically unhealthy workplaces with the aim of improving conditions and productivity.

Creative minds

Creativity is often considered an art over science, yet both are needed in order to deliver advertising success. The Ehrenberg-Bass Institute for Marketing Science is leading the charge with research that focuses on the development of empirically grounded knowledge that helps brands to understand the mechanics behind marketing and how to spend their advertising dollars in the right way. The Institute's multi-million dollar corporate research and development program delivers world-leading marketing insights to companies such as Proctor & Gamble, CBS and Nestlé.

War on cancer

Using advanced computing simulation, UniSA's world-leading radiation oncology and radiobiology researchers can analyse and predict the combination of treatment for hard to treat cancers. Our technology allows us to grow biologically correct tumours that represent a patient's cancer, to measure how quickly it will grow and how aggressively it may spread. By predicting the best treatment plan and providing the right schedule and dose that will target the cancer while sparing healthy cells, we are one step closer to winning the war on cancer.

Redefining child protection

UniSA researchers from the Australian Centre for Child Protection are leading the development of new approaches to preventing and responding to child abuse and neglect, challenging the key assumptions which have underpinned child protection research and system design for the past two decades. The Centre has spearheaded the application of contemporary evidence, research and a public health approach, resulting in rapid research translation, close collaboration with partners and policy and practice reforms.

Industry connected and engaged



Real solutions don't happen without great partnerships and we are collaborating with local icons and international heavyweights to drive the advancements behind a better society. Across the University, we seek to match our research capability and strengths with the opportunities, challenges and needs of our partners, and maximise the mutual benefits of engagement.

Best on ground

Our industry connections extend into the sporting elite through a partnership with the Adelaide Crows Football Club. UniSA students have the opportunity to complete internships in the AFL, and we are paving the way for further collaboration in sports science and sports business research.



Shatterproof mirrors

Through our collaborative research approach, we have partnered with SMR Automotive to deliver the world's first shatterproof plastic car mirror. This advancement has decreased the product weight by 50%, reducing fuel consumption and greenhouse gas emissions, and increasing its safety rating.

A new dawn

UniSA has partnered with one of Australia's most successful visual effects companies, Rising Sun Pictures, giving film and television students the opportunity to complete part of their degree in professional film studios, working alongside some of the best in the movie business.

Tech giants

Engineering and information technology students now have access to the latest software through a \$450 million commercial grant from tech giants Siemens to prepare them for Industry 4.0. It allows them to explore trends in improved automation, machine-to-machine communication, artificial intelligence and continued digitisation of manufacturing.

Partners in IT

UniSA is partnered with global IT giant DXC Technology to support South Australia's IT innovators, including students and industry, with a new space to exchange and explore ideas. This partnership was the first of its kind in Australia and incorporates internship opportunities where students can learn from world-class experts in their field.

Data driven

UniSA's spin-off company, Myriota, is changing the game of data distribution. Raising A\$28 million in funding, the company is growing its satellite network to support billions of devices and make data more accessible for all Australians.

Business growth

The Australian Centre for Business Growth works to help small to medium enterprises (SMEs) reach their potential with the latest research, training and advice.

Smart satellites

UniSA is proud to lead the largest investment in space industry R&D, along with a network of national and global partners. The Cooperative Research Centre for Smart Satellite Technologies and Analytics (SmartSat CRC) is aiming to lift Australia's space industry to A\$12 billion and generate an extra 20,000 jobs by 2030.

Virtual realities

The University's Australian Research Centre for Interactive and Virtual Environments (IVE) is a world leader in augmented and virtual reality technologies, partnering with companies such as Google, Saab, Amazon and Siemens to solve large-scale industry challenges.

Innovation hub

The Innovation and Collaboration Centre (ICC) is a strategic partnership between UniSA and the South Australian Government, aimed at supporting technology-based incubation and business growth for startups and new ventures. The ICC provides a unique environment, offering services and expertise in business management, strategy and marketing, commercialisation, design and technology.

Cancer hope

In partnership with medical device company, Ferronova, a team of experts (including researchers from UniSA) have developed new technology to improve the early detection of cancer. Moving into the next trial phase, the hybrid smart magnetic and fluorescent nanoparticle technology is capable of detecting cancer in its very early stages, which can't be done by current medical imaging practices.

MOD. is also home to Australia's first Science on a Sphere – a three-dimensional video projection that displays planetary data onto a room-sized sphere giving visitors an astronaut's view without leaving the ground.
