Professor Slay works with industry, state and federal governments undertaking collaborative research in forensic computing, information assurance and critical infrastructure protection. Earlier this year, she was made a member of the Order of Australia (AM) for her service to the information technology industry.

Detective Senior Sergeant Barry Blundell

Barry is Officer-in-charge of the South Australia Police, Electronic Crime Section. With 20 years experience working in areas such as organised crime, child exploitation and electronic crime, he has undertaken computer forensics since 1998 and provided expert evidence in court. In addition, Detective Sergeant Blundell lectures at UniSA on e-crime, e-discovery and forensic readiness.
