Important information to students about Coronavirus

Dear Student

As you will be aware from media reports, there is an unfolding public health situation with a new type of flu virus (coronavirus), the impact of which is currently being felt in China with travel restrictions in affected regions. The University is monitoring the situation closely and is in communication with SA Health and relevant national agencies so that we can support our student and staff community. While we acknowledge that the situation continues to evolve, UniSA has decided to suspend travel to China for any students (undergraduate, postgraduate or higher degree by research) who are undertaking this travel as part of their course or program requirements until the situation resolves.
