Dear colleagues and students,

I write to inform you that the University today received notification that one enrolled student in our community has returned a positive test for COVID-19.

Our number one priority is the health, safety and wellbeing of our students, staff and the entire University community. Our thoughts are with our student, who is well and is now in self-isolation and under the care of SA Health. The University has been in contact with the student to offer appropriate support.

The student attended our Magill campus last week before being diagnosed.

The University has provided SA Health with all relevant class lists and has also directly contacted staff and students where contact may have occurred during this period.

The University continues to work with SA Health to ensure the health and safety of all our students, staff and the wider community. The current global health crisis is continually evolving. We will continue to follow and act on all current health advice and guidance.

All necessary cleaning protocols have been enacted and the campus remains open.

In a community as large and diverse as ours, it was inevitable that an instance of COVID-19 exposure would present in time. Please be assured that all appropriate protocols have been activated. This is a time for us to act as a community, to follow official health advice, to remain connected and to support one another.
