Experiment Playground is a remarkable media 'playground', with interactive works of art that re-invent the gallery space as an environment of audience participation and discovery. Experimenta Playground showcases the latest work from Australia's leading media artists and from artists around the globe.

William Kentridge is one of the most important and internationally celebrated artists of our time, whose unusual filmic installation at the recent 2008 Biennale of Sydney, has been acclaimed by audiences and critics alike. His renowned 8-minute animated film, *Tide table*, is a moving tale of death and desperation, but which also expresses play, passion and spiritual regeneration. *Tide table* exemplifies Kentridge's distinctive filmic technique, in a work that connects powerfully and viscerally with audiences.

Catalogues and brochures accompany both exhibitions, including a full-colour, *Experimenta Playground* catalogue, with an essay by co-curators Liz Hughes and Emma Mc Rae. The *Tide table* brochure includes an essay by Anthony Bond, Director of Curatorial Services at The Art Gallery of New South Wales.
